Committee resulting in four standing committees as follows: Executive,
Finance, Communications, and Programs.

Spending Plan Amendments	Mr. Ericson recommended the board approve amendments to the FY19 and five-year spending plans as presented to the board that support the outlined funding recommendations as well as the future investments by Colorado Parks and Wildlife.

Colorado Parks and Wildlife Extension Requests	Ms. Orbanek presented on and recommended approval of Colorado Park and Wildlife's extension requests for logs 15213 and 15214 until June 20, 2019 and logs 16192 (and all associated logs), 16153, 16206, 16208, 16209, 16223, 17164, 17226, 17165 and 17227 until June 30, 2020.
	Mr. Burke moved Resolution 2018-28; Ms. Velasquez Horvath seconded. Motion carried unanimously (17-0).
<u>Generation Wild OMNI</u> <u>Survey Results, FY20</u> <u>Objectives</u>	Ms. Dempsey and the Sukle Advertising team presented on the results of the longitudinal Generation Wild research study, discussed a vision for a third phase of the program (2019-2020), and with the endorsement of the Communications Committee, recommended the approval of a Communications FY20 budget of \$2.5 Million.

CYCA Update	Mr. Segerstrom and Ms. Holmes provided a presentation on GOCO's impact on the CYCA.
